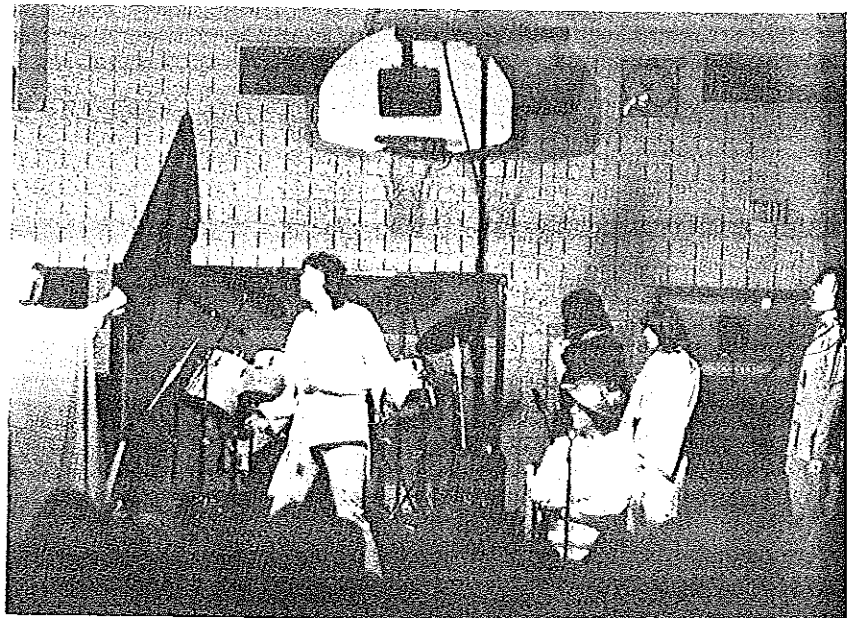
Students' Council Sponsored Events

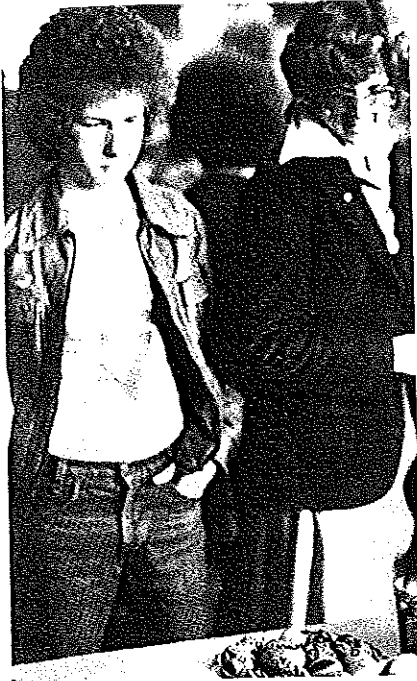
To your right is the Free Fare group, a traveling group of musicians from the states who gave a concert at Elgin this year.

People from both the school and the community came to enjoy the quilt making and other live action exhibits.

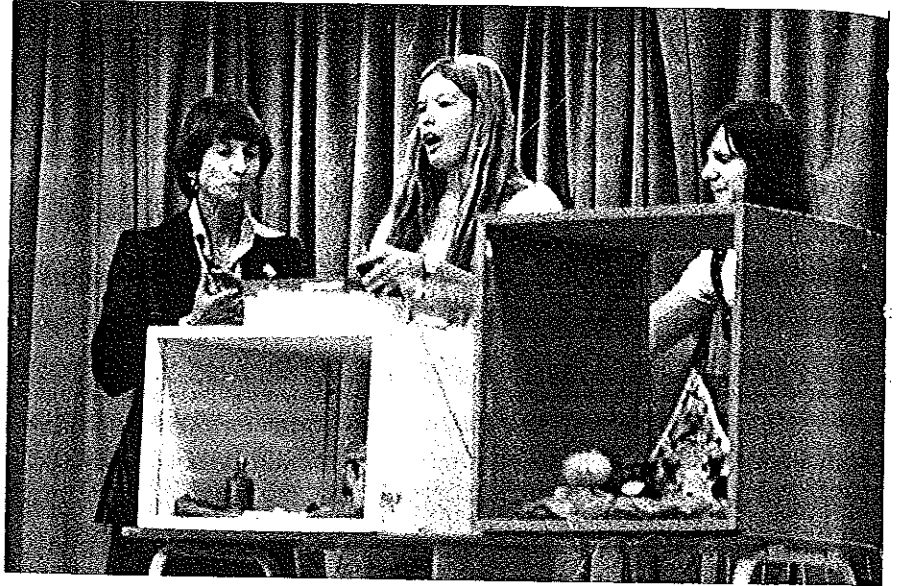

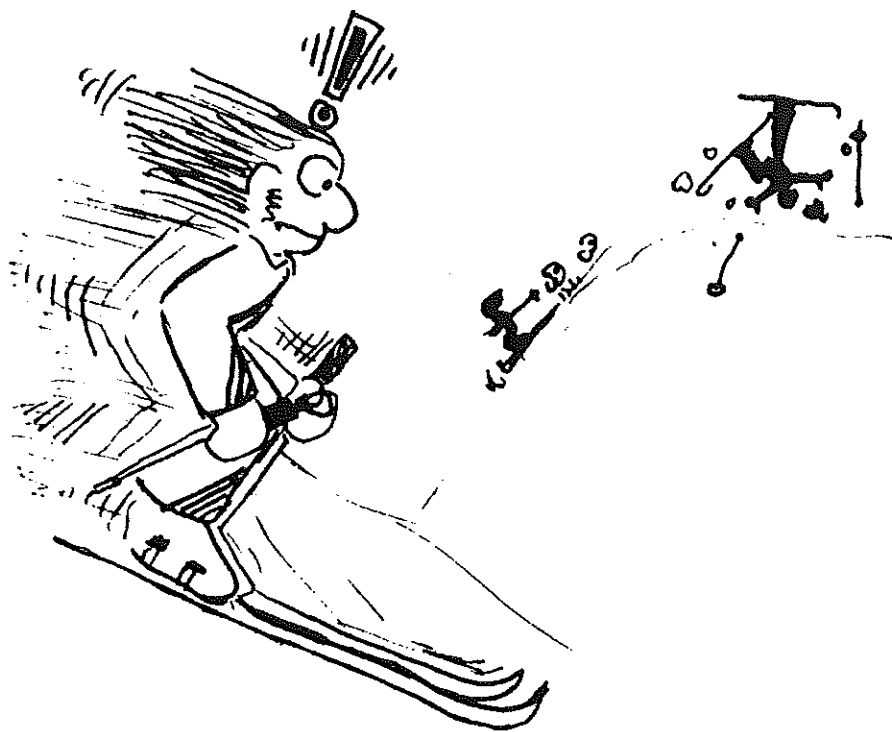

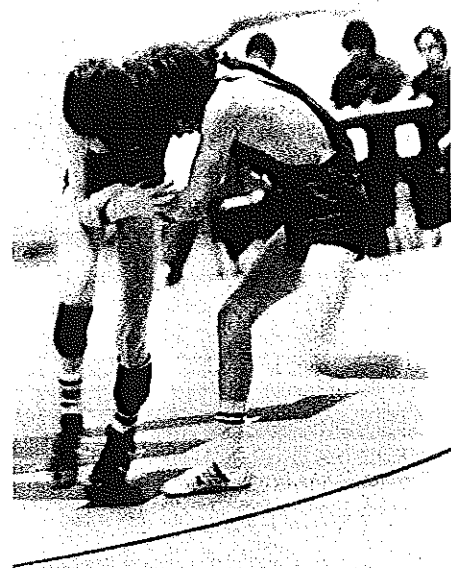

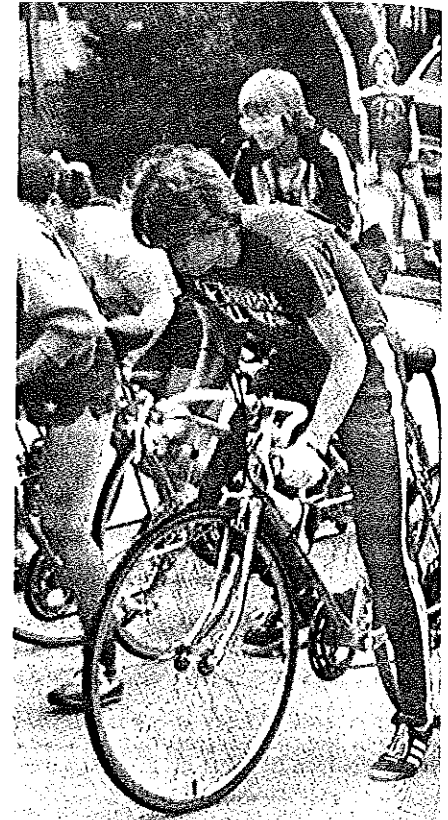
